



Jeanette Lee “Black Widow” Fights Ovarian Cancer

Billiards icon supporters rally behind Jeanette Lee Legacy Fund

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 18, 2021 -- Billiards icon and [Asian Hall of Fame](#) inductee [Jeanette Lee](#) has been diagnosed with stage four ovarian cancer. Jeanette Lee states, “I intend to bring the same resolve I brought to the billiards table to this fight. Jim Valvano so eloquently told us to ‘never give up’. I owe it to my three young daughters to do exactly that.”

Korean-American Lee was a top-ranked billiards professional, winning over 30 national and international titles. She was a World Games Gold Medalist and became known to a global audience when ESPN broadcast Women’s Professional Billiard Association tournaments. Her unique style and competitive excellence earned her the moniker “Black Widow”.

Honored four years as *Billiards Digest*’s Most Powerful People in the Sport, Lee competed in Korea’s *Dancing with the Stars* and published *The Black Widow’s Guide to Killer Pool*. In 2013, Lee was inducted into the Billiard Congress of America Hall of Fame.
